This map depicts the gaps in HEP accessibility in Illinois as of December 2021. It shows the location of the 11 HEP programs offered at 11 out of 28 (less than 40%) Illinois Department of Corrections (IDOC) correctional facilities. While students have access to individual courses in 11 facilities, Bachelor of Arts/Science degrees are only offered at 4 IDOC facilities. Only 1 IDOC facility offers a Master of Arts degree. There are 17 IDOC facilities, the majority in central and southern Illinois, that do not offer any HEP programming.
